

ABOUT THE BOOK

Crows are fascinating and resilient birds. I Am We unpacks these mysteries, exploring how and why crows roost together by the thousands and their reliance on cooperation and community.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Digging Deeper

After reading the main text together, assign one section of the backmatter to each of several small groups. Each group reads their section, takes notes, and presents what they learned to the class.

Crow Tales

Invite students to write a fictional story from the point of view of a crow. Ask them to consider what kind of mood or tone they want to create.

Crow Comparison

Use a Venn diagram to brainstorm similarities and differences between crows and another intelligent and highly social animal: people.
